

SENIOR YEAR COLLEGE CALENDAR

In late August or early September, each student must make an appointment with Mrs. Skiff or Ms. Wilson to discuss summer visits and interviews, and to more clearly define goals and aspirations for college. There will be College Seminar classes when school begins, but regular individual conferences must be the pattern so that all our resources to help students can be put to the best use. Each student must keep a record of visits, interviews, SAT/ACT records, and deadlines. There is a great deal of “paperwork” (both real and electronic) involved in college admissions procedures, and orderly record keeping becomes crucial.

August - December	SAT, SAT Subject Tests, and ACT testing will be offered for seniors. Students can take only one battery of tests on each day. The normal course is to take the SAT in October or November and SAT Subject Tests in November or December (if needed) and/or the ACT in September or October. Remember, it is up to the student to check college requirements for tests, and to have test results submitted to the colleges through the testing agencies. All scores from previous SATs are included in these reports to colleges, unless Score Choice is elected. See the College Board website for details. ACT sends scores by test date.
September- December	All applications must be completed by students and submitted to the colleges.
October	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Early Decision, Early Action, and Rolling Decision candidates complete applications- College Day/College Night- Students submit “yellow sheets” to counselors to request application materials be sent to early decision and/or early action colleges.
November	Early Decision and Early Action applications due at colleges*
December	Early Decision and Early Action results released from most colleges which have these plans*
January	Early Decision II and Regular Decision applications due at colleges*
February	Early Decision II and some Early Action results released
Mid-March - April 1	Remaining decisions released by colleges
May	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Candidates Reply Date: May 1- Advanced Placement Tests given during two weeks in early May
May - August	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- If space become available, colleges will notify about admittances off of the waiting list.- Pay attention to mail, email, and/or portals for important information about housing, orientation, course registration, etc.

*These are general guidelines. Some colleges have October deadlines for EA and/or November and December deadlines for regular decision.
